.....ABOUT HER EVS – PROJECT IN THE SCHOOL CENTER IN GRODEK (POLAND),

This year gave me the opportunity to be more open minded; I discovered new country, new culture and new language. The last nine months I've shared the daily life of polish people, I took part in their activities, they invited me for religious celebrations, I learned to love their country and respect their culture. I wondered several times "How open I am to try myself in new thing?" I was very fortunate because people took care of me and tried to make contact with me, have a real connection. I was in a country with different rights than in France, and I keep having problems with the narrow mentality of some people.

During my EVS project I managed to organize a virtual project between my former High School in France and the school where I worked in Poland. I did this project with a teenager class. With my coordinator we managed to organize French lesson for student who were interested. I have one lesson a week I have now and the possibility to teach them my mother tongue. I'm proud to share my

Twice a week this year I took part to polish lesson, learn this new language was difficult for me. Indeed the grammar is totally different if we compare with French or English. I realized after some months how that was benefit to try to learn this language to taking part of polish culture and sharing more with people from Poland.

I was impressed when I discovered I can manage my own lesson with my polish students, I am able to communicate with them with basic word in polish and especially we try to go beyond the misunderstanding with movements and drawings. I realized that in the same time when I was teaching the first lessons, I was in the same time learning more polish words to help my students with informal activities thanks to games, and songs.
